The Computer Science department provides internet services to all the staff and students. The computer laboratory is open from 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM, and also provides central computer facility, which can be accessed by all. All the students make use of this facility for academic purposes. The Library Cyber centre offers Internet access free of cost to staff and students from 7.30 am to 2.00 pm. There are 5 computers with Internet connection in the library. The computer science department imparts computer literacy to all the teaching and non-teaching staff and students, offering basic computer course like certificate course, bridge course and internet operation training.
