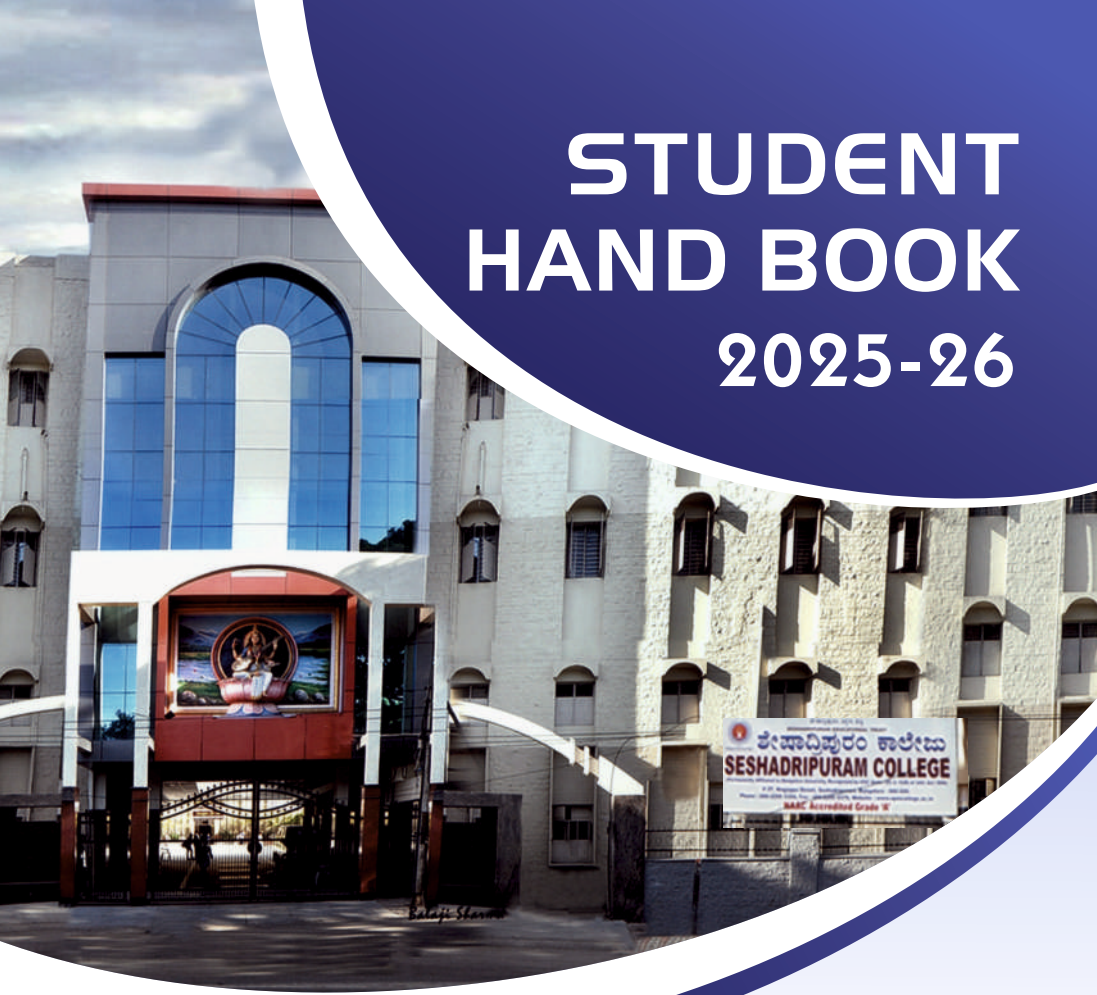

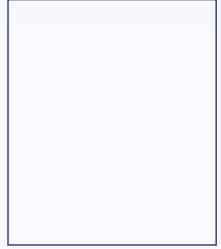

ETHICS AND CODE OF CONDUCT

- **Parking of Vehicles**

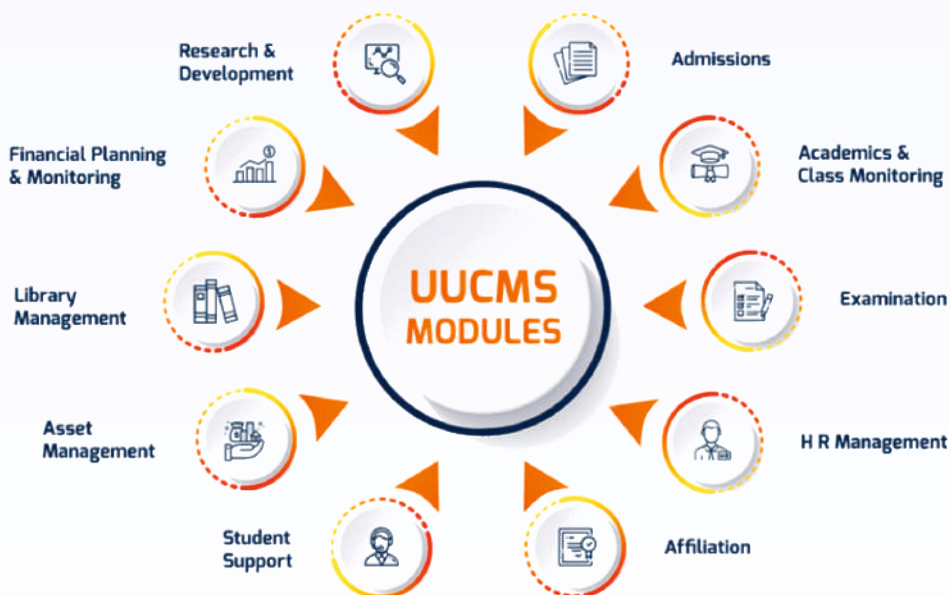
Vehicles are not allowed inside the campus and must be parked outside.

ABOUT UUCMS

The Unified University & College Management System (UUCMS) is a flagship project envisioned by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Karnataka. The UUCMS unifies and integrates the functioning and the governance of all colleges and public universities in the state bringing all of them under one umbrella.



ATTENDANCE

- a. For the purpose of calculating attendance, each semester shall be taken as a Unit.
- b. A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for the semester, if he / she has attended not less than 75% in aggregate of the number of working periods in each of the courses compulsorily. A student who fails to complete the course in the manner stated above shall not be permitted to take the University examination.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

- a. There shall be a University examination at the end of each semester. The maximum marks for the university examination in each course/paper shall be 80.
- b. Of the 20 marks allotted for Internal Assessment, 10 marks shall be based on average of two tests (20 Marks each). Each test shall be of at least 01 hour duration to be held during the semester. The remaining 10 marks of the Internal Assessment shall be based on Attendance and Assignments /skill development exercises of 05 marks each.
- c. The marks based on attendance shall be awarded as given below:
76% to 80% = 02 marks
81% to 85% = 03 marks
86% to 90% = 04 marks.
91% to 100% = 05 marks.

MINIMUM FOR A PASS

- (a) No candidate shall be declared to have passed the Semester Examination as the case may be under each course /paper unless he/she obtains not less than 35% (i.e. 28 marks out of 80) marks in written examination / practical examination and 40% marks in aggregate of written/ practical examination and internal assessment put together. However, there is no minimum marks to pass internal assessment tests including other Internal Assessments such as VivaVoce, Internship Report, Field Survey Report and similar others.
- (b) A candidate shall be declared to have passed the program if he/she secures at least 40% of marks or a CGPA of 4.0 (Course Alpha-Sign Grade P) in aggregate of both internal assessment and semester end examination marks put together in each course of all semesters, such as theory papers/ practical / field work / internship / project work / dissertation / viva-voce, provided the candidate has secured at least 40% of marks in the semester end examinations in each course.

STUDENT RULES FOR EXAMINATION

1. Students should bring their Identity Card and Hall Ticket during the examinations without fail. Students are not allowed to write examination if they do not bring both ID card and hall ticket.
2. Students should be present in the Examination Hall 15 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
3. Students should be seated in their allotted places only, as per their Register Numbers.
4. Printed/written materials, watches, mobile phones, scientific calculators, any kind of electronic gadgets, purse/wallet, pouches, wrist bands, shoes and jackets are strictly not allowed inside the examination hall.
5. Thoroughly check the page numbers of your answer booklets. If any sheets are missing or any discrepancies are found, immediately inform the room invigilator. Read the instructions carefully provided on the answer booklets before writing the exam and do not make any mistakes in filling up the front sheet.
6. Obey the instructions given by your room invigilator. Malpractice of any kind will lead to debarment of student from taking up any further examinations.
