

Seshadripuram College, Bangalore, offer MCA course affiliated to Bangalore City University under AICTE regulations in 2023-24. The Master of Computer Applications (MCA) is a two-year program designed for students to flexibly adapt, consistently adhere to principles, effectively apply their skills, and strive for a harmonious balance and excellence in their careers. Through this empowerment, they are enabled to contribute significant value to both Industry and Society.

The department envisions building technically skilled, knowledge driven students who are industry ready and are able to meet all challenges by being socially responsible Quality driven citizens for the nation.

- To bridge Industry academia gaps through quality driven learning environment by providing participative and experiential learning opportunities.
- To impart holistic and inclusive technological learning through a blend of value-based education.
- To nurture skills and aim for professional development and progress through sustained and innovative learning methods.



UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS

Regulations of Master of Computer Applications (MCA) course as per the Bangalore city of University are as follows:

- **❖ TITLE OF THE COURSE:** The course shall be called MCA Master of Computer Applications.
- **DURATION OF THE COURSE**: The course of study shall be two years.
- ❖ ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION: A candidate with any degree of a minimum of 3 years duration (10+2+3) of Bangalore university or of any other University equivalent there in to with a minimum of 50% of marks in the aggregate of all subjects including languages, if any, provided further, that the candidate has studied Mathematics / Computer science /Business Mathematics / Statistics / Computer Applications / Electronics as a subject at PUC level or equivalent HSC (XII Standard) or at Degree level is eligible for admission to MCA Course. Relaxation to SC/ST, Group I be extended as per University norms.
- * ATTENDANCE: In each Semester a candidate should be considered to have successfully undergone the prescribed Course of study if the candidate has attended at least 75% of the classes in each subject (Theory, Lab & Practical).

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

The Internal Assessment marks should be decided for each of the theory subjects by conducting 2 tests, each of 60 minutes' duration, spread over the span of a Semester. A seminar/assignment should also be given by the student in each semester and the same to be assessed and evaluated for internal assessment along with two tests.

The Internal Assessment marks in Practical course is based on the performance in the Laboratory. The Internal Assessment marks for Project work of a candidate is based on the dissertation and seminar.

ELIGIBILITY TO GO TO THE HIGHER SEMESTER:

- A Candidate is allowed to carry over all the previous uncleared (failed) theory papers and
 Practical's to subsequent semesters from the first to fourth semester.
- The maximum period for the completion of the course shall be four years from the date of admission.

❖ MINIMUM FOR PASS AND DECLARATION OF RESULTS

o For a pass in a semester, a candidate shall secure a minimum of 40% of the marks prescribed for a subject in the University Examination (Theory, Practical, Project work)

- and 50% of the marks in the aggregate inclusive of the Internal Assessment marks obtained in all subjects put together.
- The candidates who do not satisfy 7(A) shall be deemed to have failed and have to take exams in the subjects in which he has secured less than 40% at the University examination.
- o Provision is made for rejection of results of all the subjects of a Semester only once, if the candidate decides to reappear for all the subjects of that semester. Such rejection should be made within 30 days of announcement of result, by making a written application, through the Head of the Institution. If such rejection is in respect of the results of all the subjects of one semester and earn fresh Internal marks as well.
- The results of any semester will be declared as pass or fail as the case may be in accordance with regulation 7(A).
- To be eligible for the award of the MCA degree, a candidate shall have completed the scheme of training and passed in all subjects prescribed for the Course.
- o Further to regulation 7(A), the classification followed by the University for all PG courses shall be made applicable for the declaration of results of each Semester.
- CLASSIFICATION OF RESULT FOR THE MCA COURSE AND DECLARATION OF RANKS:

Further to regulations 7(A) and 7(F), the names of all successful candidates securing First Class with Distinction and First Class in the First attempt shall be arranged in the order of Merit and only first FIVE Ranks shall be declared.

❖ A CANDIDATE SHALL COMPLETE EXAMINATIONS OF ALL SEMESTERS OF MCA COURSE WITHIN - FOUR YEARS FROM THE DATE OF ADMISSION.



- **❖ Campus cleanliness**: Littering, defacing walls or desks, damaging college property are serious offenses.
- ❖ Posters and notices: Posters and notices must be placed on boards kept for the purpose in different blocks, not on the walls or other common areas of the college.
- ❖ Dress code: Both boys and girls are expected to dress in conformity with norms of decency and propriety.
- ❖ Identity card: Inside the college premises students must wear their ID card.
- Association functions and cultural programs are organized only after class hours.
- Outsiders: Outsiders are not permitted to attend college functions.
- Picnics or class socials: Students are not allowed to organize them.

ATTENDANCE AND EVALUATION

❖ Academic Evaluation

Academic assessment is an important administrative function that determines how effectively students have learned in various courses throughout the degree program.

Credit System

In accordance with the concepts and recommendations of the UGC and NAAC, advancements in evaluation methods, societal needs, and to make teaching effective and meaningful, the college has implemented Credit-Grade-based Performance Assessment (CGPA) for all courses offered.

Attendance

- ➤ Daily class attendance is mandatory, with exceptions for genuine reasons like ill-health.
- Attendance is recorded in a register and monitored by PLV application.
- > Students can view their updated attendance.
- Monthly once attendance status report will be sent to respective parents.
- The University Grants Commission mandates a minimum of 75% attendance for Semester Examinations.
- Attendance will be taken count from the date of joining to the college.

Eligibility to write Semester Examination:

- Students with over 75% attendance in each paper are eligible for the end semester examination.
- After achieving 75% attendance, students can take the next available Supplementary Examinations.
- Students must register as an additional student in the first week of the same semester, paying the course fee.
- ➤ If a student fails to score at least 75% attendance, they must repeat the paper in the next available chance.
- > Students can register as an additional student during a year break in studies if they have a shortage of attendance in one subject.

***** Minimum Marks for Passing the Examination:

- ➤ Students must score 40% in CIA and 40% in SEE in each course to complete the particular course.
- ➤ For open elective papers, minimum marks are 40% in aggregate of CIA and SEE.

PROMOTION TO THE HIGHER SEMESTER

All students who qualified to take the Semester Examinations will be automatically promoted to the next semester, regardless of how many papers they failed.

❖ MAXIMUM TIME PERIOD TO COMPLETE THE COURSE

The UGC guidelines and Academic Council's approval mandate that all PG students must complete their course within four years.

> GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL - SPANDANA
